Helping Farmers Weather Crisis

The risks inherent to farming are many. There are many elements that a farmer can't control, like weather, yields, and commodity prices. Farmers are famously self-reliant, known for their incredible work ethic and resiliency to persevere in the face of unfavorable conditions. When injury or illness keeps a farmer or farm family out of the field for even a few days, it can mean disaster for the business.

Tom Meyer, director, Enterprise Product Delivery Process and the Program Management Office, and a few of his Deere-retiree friends, spent a week in May in North Dakota, helping three farm families get their crops in the ground. They did so through a program called Farm Rescue.

Farm Rescue is a North Dakota-based nonprofit that brings together people and equipment to provide planting, harvesting, and haying assistance free of charge to family farmers who have suffered a major injury, illness, or natural disaster. The equipment is an array of premium John Deere machines, provided exclusively by RDO Equipment Co., based in Fargo. The people are a team of volunteers, assembled by Farm Rescue, like Tom and his friends.

"Farm Rescue helps farm families in crisis throughout the upper Midwest," says Tom. "I ran an air seeder crew led by Mark Baumgarten, a John Deere retiree in his third year of volunteering for Farm Rescue, and retirees Ken Enstrom and Rick McAnally."

The crew worked for a week, planting over 1,400 acres for three families in crisis. See news coverage and video of the effort:

"The families we worked with included a farmer who broke his back right at the start of seeding, and two families with members going through cancer treatments," says Tom. "We helped them get their crops in the ground."

Tom is an advocate for Deere's <u>Dollars for Doers</u> program, which provides \$1,000 grants to non-profit organizations that an employee volunteers with for 40 hours in a fiscal year.

"Farm Rescue was a great opportunity to not only help people, but also volunteer enough time to earn the \$1,000 from Dollars for Doers," says Tom. "It's also a chance to operate our equipment, work with our customers, work with the dealer, and work with the other people in the community. It was a real special opportunity to be able to work in that way."

Tom feels the experience has given him a deeper understanding of customers.

"Every time I'm on a farm I learn something new. We didn't just run the seeder, we did the transporting of the equipment, made the repairs, filled the fluids, helped move the fertilizer and the seed - we did everything that the farmer would be doing. It helps me to understand not only the state-of-the-art equipment provided by RDO, but the environment that it works in."

The strength of the Farm Rescue organization, the generosity of RDO Equipment Co., the kindness of the program sponsors and individual donors, and the dedication of the volunteers boils down to one goal: keeping a farm family going through crisis. Emotion overcomes Tom when he describes the experience.

"The families that we work with are very appreciative and happy to have us here," says Tom. "Neighbors and family members bring lunch out to us. They invite us into their homes. They come out and help us any way they can and thank us over and over again. People in the community come up to thank us for being here to help out their neighbors. The community is very supportive."
